Cornucopia Tool & Plastics, Inc. Conflict Mineral Policy

This document states Cornucopia's policy regarding the content of Conflict Minerals in our finished products.

There has been increased awareness of violence and human rights violations in the mining of certain minerals in and around the conflict region of the Democratic Republic of the Congo and surrounding countries. In 2010, the United States enacted the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act. Section 1502 of this Act aims to prevent the use of conflict minerals mined from this area. The Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) and the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI) have requested that companies undertake reasonable due diligence with their supply chain to assure that specified metals are not being sourced from mines in the conflict regions.

Cornucopia fully supports the efforts of the Dodd-Frank Act, the EICC, and the GeSI, and has obtained information from all of our current raw material suppliers containing any conflict minerals (specifically tin used in solder and solder coatings). These suppliers have demonstrated that they also understand and support the efforts listed above and are not and will not knowingly procure specified metals that originate from a conflict region. Cornucopia has obtained, or is in the process of obtaining, written evidence of due diligence from all suppliers.

Cornucopia believes we are fully compliant with current conflict-free mineral laws, and we will continue to undertake due diligence to maintain that compliance. However, because we are not the producer of most of the materials used in our products, Cornucopia shall not be liable, under law, and not responsible to defend any suppliers that may not be providing compliant materials.
